

As you read this, we are about to begin Holy Week, and that means soon we will come to Easter. Easter is such a celebration and it means a lot more if we go through the tough "dirty work" of Lent and Holy Week.

I love to entertain. I try to lay out my home so that there are lots of spaces for people to congregate and enjoy each other's company. In the past, I would volunteer my home for cast parties, for open houses for people from church, for celebrations of all kinds. My house isn't especially large and it isn't the most fancy, but its comfortable and can entertain good numbers of people pretty easily.

Since Covid, I have done that a lot less. I miss having groups of people over but most of all I miss celebrating and spending time laughing and chatting with friends. I'm actually a closet introvert so I really need my alone time too, but I still enjoy having people over and enjoying their company.

As much as Lent is a time for introspection and quiet patience, Easter is a season of celebration. We can celebrate individually the growth we made during Lent, we can celebrate warmer temperatures and flowers budding all over our neighborhoods, or we can just celebrate that we are alive and blessed by a God that loves us so much. I think one of the greatest gifts of church is community. Yes, we can find community in other contexts, but never in a context of (hopefully) genuine care for each other and a sense of vision for the future.

When I have visitors over, there is usually a context of some kind. A reason for being there. Maybe it's a Superbowl party. Or a birthday party. Or maybe they're just there to play a board game together. Whatever the reason, my favorite part is the interaction with the people. It doesn't matter in the end what game we play or whether the Superbowl went the way I wanted it to. What matters most is the quality time spent with people and how much we laughed.

Take some time this Easter season to celebrate. To laugh. And yes, Easter is a season, not just a day. It lasts six weeks. Sometime during the season make some intentional time to celebrate, laugh and show your love for others. We need it more now than ever.

A Milestone for Women Leaders in the Holy Land



International Women's Day, March 8, gives us an opportunity to honor past, present and future women leaders throughout our global community. One of those leaders is the Rev. Sally Azar, who recently became the Holy Land's first female pastor. The Rev. Azar pursued her Master of Arts degree at Near East School of Theology with the support of an ELCA International Leaders Program scholarship. On Jan. 22 she became the first woman ordained in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land (ELCJHL).

The Rev. Azar's siblings in Christ journeyed from around the world to celebrate this joyous event with the ELCJHL. ELCA Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton attended the

ordination service, along with the Young Adults in Global Mission (YAGM) participants serving in Jordan and the West Bank.

"Over 100 clergy, including my mom, attended from all over the world and across denominations," said Harper Bolz-Weber, a YAGM volunteer. "In total, more than 500 people attended the service at Redeemer Lutheran Church in Jerusalem. ... I felt honored to have been able to attend and participate in such a historic event, and I'm sure I will never forget it." YAGM volunteer Sophie Caesar also knew she was taking part in something special: "I could feel the holy spirit moving while assisting in such a monumental service."



A DEVOTIONAL REFLECTION

A Water Prayer

From the cold of winter to daylight savings time change to the first day of spring; from the season of Lent to the season of Easter; from Easter to Earth Day—we are always thinking about water. From "we need the moisture" (still shoveling snow in March) to April showers, we think about water and whether we will be irrigating our lawns and gardens this summer.

The Colorado River supplies water to Wyoming, Colorado, Utah, New Mexico, Nevada, Arizona, and California. Forty million people rely on it. Glen Canyon Dam and Hoover Dam hold most of the water. Imperial Dam holds water for agriculture in the Imperial Valley of California. The last dam is Morelos which irrigates Mexico's Mexicali Valley. Below that the river is mostly dry.

In Colorado, 24 tunnels move river water from west to east. Some of the biggest are Moffat Tunnel—Winter Park to Rollinsville for rail (since 1928) and water (since 1936); Bousted Tunnel—Arkansas/Frying Pan Project water to Turquoise Lake near Leadville; Roberts Tunnel—Lake Dillon water to Denver since 1962 (took 16 years to complete and supplies 40% of Denver's water); Hoosier Pass Tunnel—diverts So. Platte River and Blue River water to the Montgomery Reservoir near



Alma from which water is piped 70 miles to Colorado Springs by way of the Blue River Pipeline (since 1957); Straight Creek Tunnel—the Eisenhower-Johnson tunnels are also water tunnels delivering 300 acre feet of water per year to Clear Creek; Adams Tunnel from Lake Granby to Shadow Mountain to Grand Lake under Rocky Mt. Nat. Park to the Big Thompson River to the Horsetooth Reservoir, to Carter Lake, and to the Boulder Reservoir. WOW—and that is just a small part of this interesting story!

Prayer: Dear Lord, water sustains us. Every creature needs it for life. Our watery baptism sustains us. Water reminds us each day of our baptism. Christ's love surrounds us as we move about in our daily activities in our families, in our workplaces, and in our communities. We need water; it flows in us and makes us whole. Help us to appreciate and conserve the gift of water.
